

## Comments from the Prime Minister on the departure of Great Britain from the EU

In spite of the sense of disappointment which many of us feel over the result of the British referendum, we need to see that this is not the end of the world, and certainly not the end of the European Union. Britain has simply set off on another path than that of European integration. This is a serious and irreversible decision. The British will have less influence on what happens in Europe and their country overall will be weaker and less important. During the next few years they will have to fight once more to retain Scotland. The British should come to an agreement on their departure quickly and rationally. There is a need to minimise any negative consequences for EU and Czech Republic citizens. The European Union must change quickly. Not because Britain has left, but because the European project needs much stronger support from its citizens. Europe must be more action-oriented, more flexible, less bureaucratic and much more receptive to the diversity which 27 member states represent. For us, the Czech Republic, the EU represents the best possible guarantee of stability, peace and prosperity, but it needs to go through changes will secure its further viability and the trust of its citizens.
